More severe flu seasons predicted due to climate change *January 28, 2013*. A study published in <u>Plos</u> <u>Currents Influenza</u> looked at influenza and climate patterns in the U.S. from 1997 to the present. Their analysis indicates a pattern for both A and B strains: warm winters are usually followed by heavy flu seasons. <u>ScienceDaily</u>

Federal funding needed for eroding Alaska Native communities *January 30 2013.* State and federal agencies are struggling to respond to the enormous new needs brought about by climate-induced impacts on Alaska Native communities, a fact pointed out by a new report by the <u>Brookings Institution</u>. For several communities protection in place is not possible and relocation is the only adaptation strategy that can protect them from accelerating climate change impacts. <u>Alaska Dispatch</u>

Measuring the consequence of forest fires on public health *January 27, 2013.* Pollution from forest fires is impacting the health of people with asthma and other chronic obstructive lung diseases, finds a new <u>study</u> performed in the British Columbia. The study used data from pharmacies and dispensaries to measure the increase in drugs needed to alleviate symptoms associated with pollution. <u>ScienceDaily</u>

Invasive pike thriving on salmon and other species *January 25, 2013.* A federal and state study of two Alaska salmon streams indicates that nonnative northern pike can eat significant numbers of salmon smolt and thrive even when the salmon population declines. The <u>study</u> suggests that invasive pike and native salmon can co-exist if their habitat does not overlap, but where they do, salmon recovery may depend on suppressing pike. <u>Associated Press</u>
