Fish and Wildlife Releases Spring Polar Bear Fieldwork Report - USF&W has released their spring field report for polar bear populations in the Chukchi Sea region. Bears captured this spring were healthy and in good condition. They spotted lots of bears in the vicinity of Point Hope, including females with older triplets, and an enormous 1500+ pound male. Unusual was no sightings of females with "cubs of the year," perhaps indicating a lack of ice conditions appropriate for denning. <a href="https://example.com/propriate-st
