Across First Nations communities in Manitoba's Burntwood health region close to 1,000 positive test results were reported from Aug. 1, 2009 to March 31, 2010. Dr. Bruce Martin, of the University of Manitoba's Northern Medical Unit, describes the hard-to-treat problem as an "emerging infection". full story
