Peat wildfire smoke linked to heart failure risk *June 29, 2011* In the summer of 2008, a lightning strike started a wildfire in eastern North Carolina that burned for weeks. An EPA study found an increase in emergency department visits for a variety of respiratory ailments and a 37% increase in visits for people with symptoms of heart failure. ScienceDaily

Rainwater harvest study finds roofing materials differ in water quality June 15, 2011 A study recently published in Water Research tested the quality of rainwater harvested from five different roof types. Metal and concrete tile produced the best quality for domestic use while rainwater from asphalt fiberglass shingle roofs contained high levels of dissolved organic carbon (DOC). If mixed with chlorine the high DOC water can produce byproducts that can be harmful. ScienceDaily

Heavy snowfall causes fungus that can harm tundra *June 20, 2011* Heavy and prolonged snowfall can create conditions that encourage fungal growth. A new study published in *Nature Climate Change* shows that the fungus *Arwidssonia empetri* can cause rapid fungal growth and result in the die-off of tundra plants. <u>ScienceDaily</u>

Melting Northwest Passage lets Pacific whales migrate to Atlantic June 27, 2011 When a 13-meter grey whale was spotted off the coast of Israel, scientists came to a startling conclusion, it must have passed through the normally ice bound Northwest Passage. It is an indication of the speed of change that is taking place in our world and raises important questions about the future of the oceans. Associate Press
