"The hot weather in the past few weeks has really wiped out the snowpack," said John Pomeroy, a University of Saskatchewan hydrologist. All of his 35 remote monitoring stations have no snow. It means river flows in southern Alberta have already peaked. <u>Calgary Herald</u>

Research Acidification takes toll on Beaufort Sea June 15, 2015 Yereth Rosen

Surface waters of the Beaufort Sea have crossed an ominous threshold. "There's not enough calcium for a shell-bearing organism to build and maintain its shell," said Jeremy Mathis of NOAA. The Chukchi Sea and Bering Sea will follow in the foreseeable future, with water conditions that would be corrosive to many marine species. <u>Alaska Dispatch News</u>
