Greenland glaciers retreating at record pace December 7, 2015. "Two things are happening," said study co-author William D'Andrea, a paleoclimatologist at Columbia University. "One is you have a very gradual decrease in the amount of sunlight hitting high latitudes in the summer. If that were the only thing happening, we would expect these glaciers to very slowly be creeping forward. But then we come along and start burning fossil fuels and adding carbon dioxide to the atmosphere, and glaciers that would still be growing start to melt back because summer temperatures are warmer."
